# 1) B — outcomes

Domain: Key Concepts

Explanation: In ITIL 4, services facilitate outcomes customers want to achieve, enabling

value co-creation.

# 2) B — The costs removed by the service, and the costs imposed by the service

Domain: Key Concepts

Explanation: Consumers evaluate both cost types to understand overall value.

# 3) C — Using the service provider's resources

Domain: Key Concepts

Explanation: Service consumption includes utilizing provider resources as part of the service

relationship.

# 4) A — The functionality offered by a product or service

Explanation: **Utility** = "fit for purpose" — the functionality that meets a need.

assurance (warranty).
